- 1. Pre-permitting meetings with Alaska Department of Fish & Game**
  - Project outlined
  - ADF&G provides information for permitting needs
  - Baseline data established
- 2. Pre-permit submittal meetings with Alaska Department of Fish & Game**
  - Plans for development explained
  - ADF&G identifies permit requirements
- 3. Pre-permit meeting process continues**
  - Ongoing mitigation and reclamation planning
- 4. Applicant submits draft permit applications**
  - ADF&G review and comment
  - Continual component changes to avoid, minimize and mitigate impacts
  - ADF&G permit requirements:
    - » Design changes
    - » Monitoring plans
    - » Reclamation or mitigation of fish habitats
- 5. Applicant submits final applications**
- 6. ADF&G final review and approval**
- 7. ADF&G permit issuance**
- 8. Ongoing permit compliance review**
- 9. Ongoing monitoring**
- 10. Permit renewal**
